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The internal assessment mechanism at Tarakeswar Degree College is designed to be transparent and robust, ensuring a systematic approach in frequency and mode. Following the CBCS guidelines, the institution publishes a tentative schedule for internal assessments in the academic calendar before each semester. Internal evaluations allocate 15 marks per paper, divided into 10 marks for internal exams, tutorials, and classroom assessments, and 5 marks for attendance. Teaching Staff:

The performance appraisal system for teaching staff at Tarakeswar Degree College uses a multifaceted approach. This includes the

Career Advancement Scheme (CAS) and the Teachers' Performance Appraisal (TPA). ### 6.3.5 - Institutions Performance Appraisal System for teaching and non-teaching staff

#### Teaching Staff:

The performance appraisal system for teaching staff at Tarakeswar Degree College uses a multifaceted approach. This includes the Career Advancement Scheme (CAS) and the Teachers' Performance Appraisal (TPA). The evaluation process involves annual self-assessments, which are then reviewed by the IQAC Coordinator and the Principal. Student feedback is also considered in the appraisal process. Promotions are based on UGC guidelines, using the CAS and API scores. Additionally, faculty members who take on responsibilities beyond their academic roles have these contributions factored into their overall assessment.

#### Non-Teaching Staff:

The Principal/Teacher in charge and Bursar, with oversight from the head clerk, conduct annual performance appraisals for non-teaching staff. Department Heads evaluate laboratory assistants and attendants, while the Librarian appraises the library staff. Regular meetings are held to discuss performance, implement corrective measures, and enhance the work of non-teaching staff. By government regulations, incremental benefits are awarded every 10 and 20 years of satisfactory service. Promotions are discussed and approved in GB meetings, and a streamlined process facilitates this procedure.
